## Cole Davis

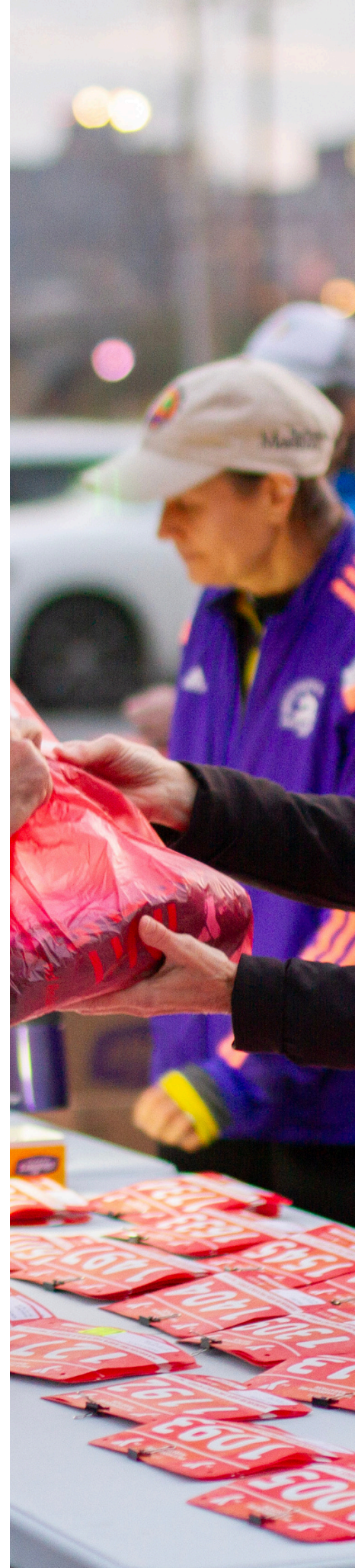
NORTHERN DAUPHIN COUNTY BRANCH
